Please rinse clean before placing in recycling bin

Do not break glass.
Broken glass must be wrapped and secured and placed in trash

Labels do not need to be removed

NO CAPS OR LIDS

Rinse thoroughly

 - Food & Beverage Cans
 - Deposit Cans
 - Pie plates/trays/foil

Please rinse clean before placing in recycling bin.

Labels can be removed and recycled with other paper and cardboard

Include metal lids



No need to flatten

- ✗ Silverware
- ✗ Small Appliances (i.e. toasters, blenders)
- ✗ Pesticides, chemicals gasoline & paint*
